Canada's Statistical System Structure

- Canada like Australia and Sweden has a centralized, primary statistical agency vs. U.S. decentralized system of 13 principal statistical agencies
- Statistics Canada is governed by the Statistics Act, Revised Statutes of Canada 1985
- Statistics Canada is a federal responsibility in Canada and StatCan produces statistics for all the provinces as well as the federal government
- 350 active surveys
- Census every 5 years

2012 Open Data License

- February 2, 2012
- “This license agreement allows you to use Statistics Canada information **without restrictions on sharing and redistribution**, for **commercial and non-commercial purposes**. You must always acknowledge Statistics Canada as the source of the information and adhere to the conditions of the Statistics Canada Open License.”
- CANSIM free
- PUMFs free but public needs to sign Open Data License and then have files sent to them
- Most aggregate products free, minus those with postal code information (i.e. Postal Code Conversion Files)
- Still pay for custom tabulations

The CD-ROM **Canadian Business Patterns** provides counts of active locations by variables like geography levels, industry classification and employment size.

This product is compiled from the Business Register, which is a repository of information on the Canadian business population.

Nationally, there were 2,410,934 active locations recorded in June.

Data from the June 2011 **Canadian Business Patterns** are available on CD-ROM. They are presented according to the 2006 Standard Geographical Classification, the 2007 North American Industry Classification System and employment categories.

Data Liberation Initiative (DLI)

- Partnership started in 1996 between post-secondary institutions and StatCan that formalized a license agreement for improving access to Canadian data
- Over 350 standard products, including PUMFs
- PUMFs are modified from Master files
- Support and training for DLI contacts (regional and national) (train the trainer model)
- Listserv – open to anyone now
- Access to DLI datafiles available to US Institutions - \$5,000

Custom Tabulations

- Open Data License capped cost to \$70/hour
- Feasibility depends on data availability, redisclosure risk and cost on time to compile
- Open Data License allows for purchased data to be made publically available with the consent of purchaser
- All retrospectively purchased custom tabulations can be shared as well

Remote Time Real Access (RTRA)

- Online remote access facility allowing users to submit SAS programs to run, more or less in real time, pulls of data and descriptive stats on (near) master-level files located at StatCan
- No travel to RDC required as can access from anywhere
- Get only aggregate tabular output out
- Geography is like CANSIM heavily aggregated (CMA)
- Surveys ([60](#)), but intent to grow - though not retrospectively
- Service is available to US Institutions - \$5,000 CDN/year

Research Data Centres

- Provides access to Master Files
- Apply for access through SSHRC (Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council)
- Project goes to StatsCan for approval
- Researchers must do a Security Check - may include fingerprints
- Access to the data in a specified RDC for given time - can change RDCs - more paperwork.
- All work stays in the RDC - nothing comes out without vetting by a StatsCan analyst, including handwritten notes
- Great opportunity for Grad students to get hands on experience with Master Files
- No cost - although including in research project budget is encouraged.

CDER

- Established in October 2012
- To provide secure access to business and economic microdata
- Cost recovery basis - initial time limit
- Researchers MUST travel to Ottawa
- Security check - same as RDC access
- Only data required for the project is available - everything else is stripped included the identifiers
- Was talk about eventually getting these files into the RDC program after vetting procedures were ironed out
- Approval takes a LONG time! Not a real option for Graduate students at the moment
